

Financial Aid

First Site offers a Financial Aid Payment Plan for those living in our On-Campus apartments. To be eligible for this payment, you must provide proof that you will be receiving Financial Aid. This proof can be obtained from the Financial Aid office or through I-Campus. You must bring this proof into our office and sign a new payment plan. Financial aid payment plans will not be accepted unless your account is in good standing.

If you have signed a Summer/Fall/Spring lease, you are required to pay twelve monthly payments under the standard payment plan. Under the Financial Aid payment plan, you are required to make your first three monthly payments, beginning in April, as scheduled. You will then pay the total of five monthly payments due September 15th and the total of four monthly payments due January 15th. To be considered for this plan, you must bring in proof and sign a new payment plan in the month of June. (Note: You must make your first three payments on time to be considered for this plan.)

If you have signed a Fall/Spring lease, you are required to make ten monthly payments under the standard payment plan. Under the Financial Aid payment plan, you are required to make your first two monthly payments, beginning in April, as scheduled. You will then pay a total of four monthly payments due September 15th and the total of four monthly payments due January 15th. To be considered for this plan, you must bring in proof and sign a new payment plan in the month of May. (Note: You must make your first two payments on time to be considered for this plan.)

If payment is not received by the end of the grace period, a 10% late fee will be assessed. If you will not be receiving your Financial Aid by September 15th or the January 15th due date, you must provide us with documentation from the Financial Aid office showing the expected disbursement date. If this is not provided before the due date, the 10% late fee will stand.

FAQ

If payment is postmarked prior to the 5th day of the month, is it still considered on time?

Payments must be received by the close of business on the 5th day of the month to be considered on time. Payments received after this time will be assessed a 10% late fee. This includes payments received in the mail, even if it is postmarked prior to the 5th of the month. If you are mailing your payment, please be sure to allow plenty of time.
